

Techsouth: World Class Speakers at Free, Regional Event

LAFAYETTE, LA – (SEND2PRESS NEWSWIRE) – TechSouth solidified its emergence as the premier technology conference in the Gulf South with the announcement of its five keynote speakers as well as a handful of the top seminar leaders who will be taking part in this year's conference, which will be held in Lafayette on April 19-20, at the Cajundome Convention Center. "In a time of tremendous competition for intellectual capital and talent, TechSouth has scored a tremendous coup," said event chairman and CIO for Lafayette Consolidated Government, Keith Thibodeaux. "And with the recent announcement of the cancellation of COMDEX, regional technology events will see increased participation from global technologists and business leaders."
