

Self-Publishers Online Conference at the Forefront of Two Key Trends: The Rise in Self-Publishing and Virtual Events

At the same time, according to a report from Market Research Media, Ltd, the virtual conference and trade show market doubled from 2008 to 2009 and is predicted to reach \$18.6 Billion from 2010 – 2015.
